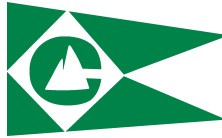

Club 420 Training

CCS is offering high school sailors the opportunity to sail and race in Club 420s. Club 420 training is a **high** skill level program. This program will **not** cover the basics of fleet racing. The program will begin with the basics of flying a spinnaker and getting on the trapeze. The training sessions will culminate with the finer points of boat handling and fleet management in this performance design.

Club 420 training sessions are based around the most important US Sailing ladder event of the summer: the Co-ed Double Handed Quarter finals– for the Bemis Cup. These training sessions will prepare sailors to compete in high level events. The cost of participation in Bemis events is in addition to the cost of the program.

Training sessions will be coached by nationally ranked, Olympic Class 470 sailors. Training sessions will be held at Carolina Yacht Club on East Bay Street. It is suggested that sailors sign up for this program with their crew member to maximize on instructional time and personal improvement . **5:30 to 7:30 Tuesdays and Thursdays**

What to Bring to Sailing Camp:

- **Type III PFD (lifejacket)** - these can be purchased at any boating store and most sport shops.
- **Wear your swimsuit under light, breathable clothing** - you can expect to get wet daily - NO Denim.
- **Water socks or old sneakers or sailing booties** - CLOSED TOE SHOES ARE REQUIRED, the type makes very little difference, they will get wet.
- **Water bottle** - we will provide a water cooler for easy fill ups.
- **Sun Protection** - the sun is very strong when out on the water, hat and sunglasses are suggested in addition to sunscreen.

Driving Directions:

From 17 N: Stay in right lane over Ashley River Bridge, merging Right on to Lockwood Dr, after passing Ashley marina turn Right into City Marina (17 Lockwood Dr.)*

From 17 S: After crossing Cooper River Bridge go through five traffic lights, turn left on to Lockwood Dr at the sixth, at third traffic light turn right into City Marina (17 Lockwood Dr.)*

*Upon entering City marina turn right through parking gate (gate with booth) - Take ticket. Proceed through parking lot (towards Charleston YC). Park between YC and Brick office building. Walk down main city marina dock, make an immediate right onto first dock on right (P dock) - continue on dock as if you were going to walk under the connector bridge, follow until you see CCS.

If a camp is cancelled you will be immediately notified and your enrollment fee will be returned in full.
