**Confirmation:** Confirmation of your registration will be e-mailed. If the session is full, you will be notified by phone. Every effort will be made to place you in another session or you can be placed on a waitlist. Sessions are filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

**Session Cancellation Policy:** If you wish to cancel, please notify CCSI office at least one week prior to the start of the session to receive a refund, after that time there are NO refunds. Refunds are subject to a \$30 cancellation fee. We reserve the right to cancel courses due to insufficient enrollment. If a class is cancelled, full credit for the class will be issued with notification information.

**Weather/Illness Cancellation Policy:** Classes will take place regardless of weather. When poor weather conditions occur, other sailing related activities are put into practice. Refunds/make-up classes will not be given due to weather or classes missed due to illness. Businesses in marina vicinity may be visited for field trips such as UK Sail Loft or walking dock at Charleston City Marina.

**Swimming Requirements:** Children must be comfortable in and around water and be able to swim unaided and tread water. A swimming check out with lifejacket on will be given on the first day of class. This will allow the staff to check the swimming abilities of your child. The staff will also conduct a water orientation with a sailboat in order to teach self-rescue techniques.

**Student Conduct:** Students are required to follow the CCSI code of good conduct. Respect for fellow students, safety, equipment, and the facility are paramount. When behavioral problems occur, every effort will be made to resolve the problem. If the behavioral problem is repeated or is serious, a Charleston Community Sailing Inc. staff member will contact the parent. There are no refunds for expulsion from CCSI for behavioral problems.

## THE BOATS

### OPTIMIST

Optimists are designed for young kids, 8-15 years old. They can handle them without danger, fear or back-strain and sail them singlehanded. The Opti is not only one of the biggest classes in the world, it is the fastest growing.

### O'PEN BIC

The fast, planing hull gives a dynamic sailing experience of a true dinghy that heels. Being at the helm of this powerful machine gives you the same excitement normally experienced on a boat for adults. Capsizing is even fun!

### VANGUARD 420

The 420 is manageable for sailors coming out of the Opti class and enables young sailors to learn teamwork skills that simply can't be learned in single handed boats. The 420 is simple and safe for beginning sailors and yet quick enough to keep collegiate All-Americans interested.

## WHAT TO BRING

Wear a bathing suit and/or clothes & closed toed shoes that can get wet. Bring a towel, change of clothes (if needed), hat, water bottle, sunscreen, and sunglasses. Bring snacks if needed.

*\*All students taking a sailing class must be able to swim.*

## DIRECTIONS

**From I-26** - Take I-26 to the end follow signs to Hwy 17 South. Once on Hwy 17 South (Crosstown), go through 4 lights, staying in the center lane. Follow signs to Lockwood Dr. Turn left onto Lockwood Dr. (before you cross the Ashley River Bridge). Marina is .5 miles on the right at the 2nd stoplight.

**From Hwy 17 South** - After crossing the Arthur Ravenel Bridge into downtown Charleston, stay on Hwy 17 South (Crosstown) and go through 4 lights, stay in the center lane. Follow signs to Lockwood Dr. Turn left onto Lockwood Dr. (before you cross the bridge). Marina is .5 miles on the right.

**From Hwy 17 North** - After crossing the Ashley River Bridge, follow signs to Lockwood Dr. South (1st Lockwood exit). Bear right onto Lockwood Dr. Marina is on the right at the second stoplight.

## GUPPY PROGRAM - NEW!

Never too young to sail! This program is designed to help young children become more comfortable around the water and on boats, while using arts & crafts. Students will participate in the basic learning activities and games with a focus on building confidence, safety, and fun. They will also get the opportunity to sail with an instructor. ## BEGINNER SAILING

The beginner class familiarizes students with the basics of sailing and to allow them to feel comfortable on the water. Students will learn safety skills such as righting a capsized boat, as well as basic nomenclature and rigging/derigging skills. Students will learn how to safely dock and will be able to sail independently. The basics of tacking and jibing will be covered.

## INTERMEDIATE SAILING

The intermediate class will build upon the skills learned in the beginner class. Intermediate sailors will gain knowledge of sail trim, points of sail, and racing basics. Sailors will learn how to sail in various wind conditions, on different points of sail. Students will gain a greater understanding for sail trim. This class will also introduce students to racing basics such as courses, starts, and basic rules and will teach the students a great deal.

## HIGH SCHOOL RACING

The advanced curriculum teaches students how to sail fast and smart. This class teaches the finer points of sail shape, boat handling speed, as well as tactical skills for starting, reading wind shifts and current. Sailors will gain a feel for the boat and will understand how slight adjustments can make a big difference. The sailors will gain a greater insight into racing skills and rules, while learning skills that even the best sailors work to improve upon for a lifetime.
